



## Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

This statement is made by AIG Life Limited (AIG Life). We are committed to ensuring that no practices of modern slavery or human trafficking take place within AIG Life and its subsidiaries, whether directly or within our supply chain, and we continue to review our practices for consistency with best practice. This is AIG Life's fifth statement and supplements its previous statements. This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 (the Act) and constitutes AIG Life's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ended 31 December 2020. The statement is subject to annual review.

### Organisation Structure and our business and supply chains

AIG Life Limited is a provider of life and protection insurance products and forms part of the Life business unit within the Life & Retirement division of American International Group, Inc (AIG, Inc.) and is part of the AIG Group of companies. Its ultimate parent company is AIG, Inc. which is headquartered in New York, the United States of America. AIG Life's structure and supply chains remain broadly unchanged from what was stated in its previous statements. AIG Life's subsidiaries are Group Risk Services Limited and Group Risk Technologies Limited and the subsidiaries do not meet the Act's reporting threshold of £36 million annual turnover.

### Combating slavery and human trafficking and identifying any risks

We continue in our zero-tolerance approach to modern slavery and human trafficking in our organisation and our supply chains and we oppose modern slavery and human trafficking in any form. As stated in our previous statements, AIG Life is committed to conduct its business in an ethical and lawful manner. AIG Life continues to procure various products and services necessary to operate its business on an outsourced basis through third parties. Our supply chains include third party suppliers of IT services, telecoms, facilities management services (including, for example, cleaning, security and stationary), marketing materials, and professional services, such as accountancy, legal and HR services.

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business and expect parties in our supply chain to adhere to these values. During 2020, at a Group level, we introduced a new Global Supplier Code of Conduct in which we make clear that AIG's suppliers are expected to take steps to ensure that no form of modern slavery exists within their supply chains or business organisations.

We continue to amend our existing supply agreements, on an ongoing basis as they are replaced or renewed, to include obligations concerning adherence to the requirements of the Act and include provisions require suppliers to undertake, on an ongoing basis, that they do not have any modern slavery or human trafficking in the businesses or supply chains, and thus support pre-contractual supplier due diligence. New supply agreements include obligations concerning adherence the Act's requirements.

As at the date of this Statement, we have not identified evidence of or received any disclosure in relation to modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains. However, we continue to monitor our supply chains closely and to properly examine any risks identified.

### Employees

We conduct pre-employment screening checks, offer standard working hours for all employees, each of our employees receives a salary which exceeds the National Living Wage and we offer training to managers to prevent bullying and harassment in the workplace. In addition, we have in place systems and policies to protect whistleblowers. This statement is made available to all of our staff members and included within our joining materials for our new employees. Employees attest to their general compliance with modern slavery law in accordance with AIG Group standards. This statement is made available to all of our staff members.

The Board Audit and Risk Committee continues to review the performance of internal controls and, in particular, the process for monitoring compliance with laws, regulations and guidance, which includes compliance with the Act.

### Declaration

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes AIG Life Limited's modern slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31 December 2020.
